POSTMARKED NO LATER THAN AUGUST 15, 2010. Each class is limited to no more than 15 students; once a class has filled, your student(s) name(s) will be put on a waiting list for that class in the order your registration form and check are received. *In August you will receive an email confirmation letter, a book/supply list, and a schedule prior to the beginning of classes.* These classes are for students in grades 4-6.

FEES:

Registration Fee (non-refundable)

\$75/family for the semester as you register (a) student(s) for the first time this school year (2010-2011)

\$ 0 for each returning student from same family for the second semester

(No Explorations registration fee if all students from family who are registering for Explorations classes are also registering for classes in the Academic Program)

Tuition \$150 per semester for science and \$100 per semester for writing classes. Monthly literature and drama workshops (\$40 each—\$35 if taking other HRM classes OR \$140 (\$35 each) for all 4 Shakespeare workshops in the semester for non-HRM students or \$120 (\$30 each) for all 4 workshops per semester for HRM students.

Exploring Science through Weekly Science Labs—

Students in grades 4-6 will use the *Real Science-4-Kids Biology Level 1* Textbook and Laboratory Workbook to introduce essential terms and concepts of biology. “Hands on” discovery and critical thinking skills will be encouraged through experiments and observation. Each lesson will involve an activity designed to take the student through the process of making observations and interpreting data while reinforcing the vocabulary and concepts learned in the lesson. Minimal reading and review of scientific terms covered in class will be assigned each week.
