| • Small-Group Instruction | Utilizing the assistance of an in-class aide, the teacher will be able to divide students into small groups of similar abilities for targeted instruction | |
| • Centers/Activities | While small groups are receiving instruction, the other students, under the supervision of an aide, will be engaged in a variety of games, drills, and activities designed to reinforce skills related to the topic of the day | |
