- For registration purposes, please use the age of your child **ON** 9/1/2024. Please update each child's age in their profile **BEFORE** registration day.
- For children between the ages of 1-5, you will choose **Mother's Day Out**. We will contact you with classroom assignments before the start of the semester.
- For children between the ages of 5-7, you will choose **Primary**. We will contact you with classroom assignments before the start of the semester.
- For children between the ages of 7-13, you will register in the **Classic** Program and choose a 1st, 2nd, and 3rd period for each child. If your child's class choice shows FULL, you may add to the waiting list, but you **MUST** choose another class for that period.
- For children between the ages of 13-16, you will choose **Teen**. (If your child is 13 and you feel they would benefit from another year in the Classic Program, please contact dawnpruyn@homerunministries.com).

Super Friday Mother's Day Out

This program will continue the ministry to the littlest in our homeschooling community, giving parents a well-earned break on Fridays! MDO classes will be small (12 students max) with an adult teacher and a teen aide. Classes will stay together as a group while they enjoy playtime with friends, stories, crafts, and playground time. The focus will be on sharing God's love through play while learning to have fun in a small group setting.

Super Friday Primary

This ALL NEW program will cater to students beginning their homeschooling journey with a fun, literature-based curriculum that is age-appropriate and accessible to pre-readers and early readers. SF Primary will have their own area at Super Friday that includes changing classes between two teams of teachers and aides, their own arrival and dismissal area and their OWN SNACK TIME all together as a group! Every semester will include fun group speakers and events, as well as guest demonstrations and activities from our most popular Super Friday Classic classes, such as Speed Stacks, DTW, Perler Beads, and more!

Super Friday Classic

Classic! Students choose 3 classes each semester from a crazy variety of extracurricular activities and crafts! Have you always wanted to learn to make jewelry? Play chess? Grow your own food? We've got you covered! Course offerings will be released soon, with old favorites and some new classes that will be a blast!

Super Friday Teen

Teens want to have a Super Friday, too! This program gives our older students a place to have fun and learn as they prepare for the world that awaits them. This semester, our teens will get to choose a class for each period from the following options (based on availability, first come, first choice).

1st period:

Skits (Magill)

A new theatre class just for teens! We will spend a lot of class time exploring the stage through games. Then, working in small groups, students will have the opportunity to create their own skits and fun lip syncs. We will also be taking it to the next level by introducing improv skills – a fun challenge for any performer! At the end of the semester, we will showcase some of our work for the parents. I hope to see you on stage and in the SPOTLIGHT!

Wiffle Ball (Santana)

Calling all baseball and softball players and those interested in learning/playing the sport!!! This will be a fun co-ed wiffle ball class consisting of learning, games, and competitive play in a team-building setting. For those who are not familiar with wiffle ball, simply put, it's baseball but with a plastic bat and ball. This class will require physical activity such as running, throwing, and swinging a bat. We will begin with instructional drills and mechanics and then transition into games leading up to a tournament. *Kids will be hit with wiffle balls; it does not hurt.

2nd period:

Forge Engine (Bryant and Berry)

Join us on a semester-long adventure in an immersive role-playing game! Students will spend time creating their characters and designing the campaign we will engage in. After creating their character and campaign, students will collaborate to solve problems and develop the adventure. *Each student will need a 10-sided die.

Leadership (Su Bahler)

This class will offer students a variety of opportunities to improve their “adulting” skills. We’ll learn about personality styles, constructive criticism, budgeting, public speaking, interviews, and much more. We strongly encourage students to take this course before they apply to be aides at Super Friday.

Yearbook (Willets)

Students will learn layout, design, caption, and photography skills as they create the Yearbook pages for Super Friday and the Home Run Academies. *Laptop/tablets recommended.

3rd period:

Art Appreciation and Painting (Hornick)

In this class we will dive into the world of famous artists and their unique styles! We will learn about artists, their lives, and their most recognizable pieces. After learning about an artist, we will then spend some time painting in their styles!

Coding (Alder)

Learn the basics of JavaScript coding language while also developing critical thinking skills and creativity! Classic Program Class Options

3-D Printing – (H. Gilbert) (\$15 class fee) **Students 10 and older**

Get ready to turn your wildest ideas into tangible creations! In this class, you'll dive into the world of 3D printing, where you'll design, model, and bring your imagination to life. From keychains to collapsible swords, the only limit is your creativity. You'll also learn about the inner workings of a 3D printer and how to design your own models in programs such as Tinkercad and Blender. Let's turn ideas into reality, one layer at a time!

Students will need a laptop and intermediate experience working with computers.

Chess for Boys – (C. Saucedo)

This class will show students how to move the pieces, how the game is won or lost, and basic tactics. For those who already know the basics, we will learn and build our strategies and skills through lessons and play. *Boys only.*

Chess for Girls – (C. Saucedo)

This class will show students how to move the pieces, how the game is won or lost, and basic tactics. For those who already know the basics, we will learn and build our strategies and skills through lessons and play. *Girls only.*

Conversational Spanish – (M. Daly)

The class will appeal to all learning types. We will have fun playing many engaging games, completing crafts, singing songs, and role-playing. In addition, students will practice vocabulary and pronunciation to enable them to order in a restaurant, ask for help, and carry on a short conversation. Students will need to bring a pocket folder on the first day of class. They will take home the course outline and vocabulary sheets each week.

Creating with Perler Beads – (N. Calderon) (\$10 supply fee)

Join us for a semester of fun making melty bead designs. Beads are placed on a peg board and melted with a hot iron. Don't worry, an adult will be doing all the ironing!

We will have some set projects, some challenge projects, and some themed projects (without a set pattern!)

Crochet for all Levels – (E. Goodrum & S. McNamara)

Have you always wanted to crochet? Come learn all the basics at your own pace in a friendly environment or take your skills a step up. We will also work on some fun and easy projects!

Dance Fitness – (R. Hatton)

A group exercise class that encompasses dance and exercise moves with positive upbeat songs to get improved coordination, agility, and cardio for a full body workout. Dance fitness will incorporate different styles of dance and appeal to kids of all ages. Suitable for all skill levels!

Dipping into Color – (J. Hornick) (\$15 supply fee)

Children will learn about the color wheel and primary, secondary, and tertiary colors. They will learn to mix and create colors, shading, shadowing, and tones. Join us as we combine all these things and sprinkle in imagination to create colorful works of art!

Drawing for All Ages – (J. Hornick) (\$15 supply fee)

Children will learn the basics of drawing in pencil and graphite, including different shading techniques, light sources, and how to place shadows for a more realistic effect. They will learn how to simplify objects, making drawing easier and more fun while putting ideas on paper and giving their art more depth.

Duct Tape Warfare – (Z. Morgan) (\$15 supply fee)

For students new to Duct Tape Warfare and younger students

Come explore Medieval history and culture with us as we create Knight-style weapons out of duct tape, foam, and PVC pipe. No experience is required!

Friday Players – (M. Magill) (\$35 class fee)

It's show time! Friday Players is a TWO PERIOD musical theatre class. (2nd AND 3rd PERIOD, with snack time in the middle)

The children will receive a script along with songs, and we will rehearse our play during class time. There will be a performance at the end of the semester to show off our hard work. We hope to see you onstage!

Gardening for Good – (S. Andress)

This class will introduce the children to God's plan for gardening in a fun and interactive way. We have been given the power and dominion to GROW THINGS! You can grow your own food indoors and outdoors, no matter the space. Students will take home a growing kit to work on and share their progress as we learn.

Girls Bible Study with Prayer and Journaling – (S. Siu) (\$15 class fee)

Intro to Coding – (B. Alder)

Each week, we will create a new piece of jewelry customizable to each student—no two pieces will be alike. Please consider that this class will involve a high level of fine motor skills to complete tasks.

LEGO Innovations – (G. Gilbert and J. Bosquez)

Construct and unleash your creativity with Lego! Each week, we will have a brief lesson and a Lego building challenge. During class, students will be able to build Lego models based on topics such as transportation, architecture, geography, history, and more! Each Lego challenge will allow the student to develop their own creation inspired by that week's lesson.

Minecraft Commanders – (L. Stinnett) For students 9 and older

Have you ever wished you could create buildings or do terraforming faster in Minecraft? In this exciting hands-on class, we will learn how to harness the power of commands to build amazing structures like medieval castles, giant bridges, mega-farms, and skyscrapers. Whether you're a beginner or you already have some experience, this course will guide you through the basics of using commands to bring new life to your Minecraft creating skills.

Students must bring a laptop with the current version of Minecraft (Java or Bedrock) installed each week to class. Note: Students may also use a table with a keyboard, but a laptop is preferred. Minute to Win It – (C. Bryant)

You have a minute—can you win it? Get ready to shake, rattle, and roll as you compete with your classmates to win wacky challenges. This is an active class and requires no previous skills—just a good attitude and a readiness to have fun!

Nailed It! – (S. Curtis) (\$15 supply fee)

Join us for this Pinterest-inspired class, where we will conquer fun crafts you can use, wear, or hang on the wall!

Nutrition & Fitness – (J. Estrada) For students 10 and older

This class is based on 1 Corinthians 6:19, "Don't you realize that your body is the temple of the Holy Spirit, who lives in you and was given to you by God? We will look at how to be good stewards of our bodies by fueling and strengthening them. We will learn exercises with bands and body weight to be the best we can be for His glory!

Physical Education – (S. Siu)

Want to get your blood pumping? Feel the need to jump and shout? This class is all about fun! We will play lots of games and have a great time while we get moving! Come have some fun with us!

Pickleball – (A. Bryant) (\$10 class fee)

Be a part of the sports sensation that is sweeping the nation! Learn the rules, skill sets, and practice with your friends.

Pokémon the Card Game – (M. Lowery & D. Ramirez) (\$15 supply fee)

Learn the basics of this popular game while also learning good sportsmanship, players etiquette, arithmetic, logical/strategic thinking, reading comprehension, and socialization. *Students will receive their own deck and other game supplies, which are included with the supply fee.*

Pokémon the Card Game ADVANCED – (M. Lowery & D. Ramirez)

The Pokemon TCG advanced course continues what was taught in the beginning course with additional one-on-one coaching from the teacher. The student will learn advanced skills such as improving deck-building and winning strategies. Students should bring their own Pokemon decks as this course will not provide one. *Must have taken one semester of the beginner class and have a legal standard deck.*

Sewing, Embroidery and Stuff Making – (D. Valdez)

Join us as we learn hand stitching, hand embroidery, and machine sewing in this brand-new class. Students will also get to design and make their own stuffed animals. *Students are not required to bring a sewing machine. We will provide equipment and supplies; students may bring their own fabric choices.*

Speed Stacks – (K. Vasquez)

Speed Stacking is one of the fastest-growing sports and was inducted into the Jr. Olympics in 2010. Speed stacking helps child stackers use both sides of their bodies and brains to develop important athletic and academic lifelong skills. Students will develop hand-eye coordination, ambidexterity, quickness, and concentration using stacked cups and a timer. Most importantly, we will have lots of fun!

Students must purchase their own set of speed stack cups with a mat and timer. We usually make a group order a few weeks before classes begin.

Sportball – (T. Yates) (\$65 class fee)

Sportball teaches the fundamental skills of 8 different sports in a fun, stress-free, non-competitive setting. Classes keep kids moving and engaged and send them home with new skills. The Sportball coach provides all the equipment. Sports instructions will cover basketball, soccer, t-ball, hockey, volleyball, tennis, golf, and football. *Students are welcome to take Sportball more than once! There is so much to learn, and skills will be improved each week.*

Strategy Board Games – (W. Berry)

Strategy Board Games is a class for students to learn and play board games. Students will work on teamwork, sportsmanship, and strategy. Board games are an excellent learning tool in which students don't even realize they are learning because they are having so much fun! Potential games include Settlers of Catan, Pandemic, Trekking the National Parks, 7 Wonders, and Stone Age.

Tournament Chess – (C. Saucedo)

Engage in different types of tournament play to take your chess game to the next level. Learn to track plays, keep score, and use a timer.
