- For registration purposes, please use the age of your child ON 9/1/2024. Please update each child's age in their profile before registration day.
- For children between the ages of 1-4, you will choose **Mother's Day Out**. We will contact you with classroom assignments before the start of the semester.
- For children between the ages of 5-7, you will choose **Primary**. We will contact you with classroom assignments before the start of the semester. (If your child is 7 and you feel that they are ready and best suited for the **Classic** program (at least a 1st-grade reading level, ready to navigate changing classes and large group), contact dawnpruyn@homerunministries.com.)
- For children between the ages of 13-16, you will choose **Teen**. (If your child is 13 and you feel they would benefit from another year in the Classic Program, please contact dawnpruyn@homerunministries.com).
- For children between the ages of 8-12, you will register in the **Classic** Program and choose a 1st, 2nd, and 3rd period for each child. If your child's class choice shows Full, you may add to the waiting list, but you **MUST** choose another class for that period.
- **"Overlap option" for students on the edge of our Classic and Teen Programs...**
Students who will be 7 years old on 9/1/2024 may choose the NEW Primary Program OR move up to Classic if their parents feel they are ready.
Students who will be 13 years old on 9/1/2024 may choose to stay in the Classic Program OR move up to Teen.
This Overlap option will only be available for the 2024-2025 school year.

This program will continue the ministry to the littlest in our homeschooling community, giving parents a well-earned break on Fridays! MDO classes will be small (10 students max) with an adult teacher and a teen aide. Classes will stay together as a group while they enjoy playtime with friends, stories, crafts, and playground time. The focus will be on sharing God's love through play while learning to have fun in a small group setting.

Super Friday Primary

This ALL NEW program will cater to students beginning their homeschooling journey with a fun, literature-based curriculum that is age-appropriate and accessible to pre-readers and early readers. SF Primary will have their own area at Super Friday that includes changing classes between two teams of teachers and aides, their own arrival and dismissal area and their OWN SNACK TIME all together as a group! Every semester will include fun group speakers and events, as well as guest demonstrations and activities from our most popular Super Friday Classic classes, such as Speed Stacks, DTW, Perler Beads, and more!

Super Friday Teen

Teens want to have a Super Friday, too! This program gives our older students a place to have fun and learn as they prepare for the world that awaits them. Weekly activities will include learning about personality and learning styles, goal setting, communication in person and in writing, budgeting, career paths, and MORE! Students will work in small groups to plan, organize and execute a t-shirt design contest for a SF fundraiser. They will learn about digital design, graphics, and publishing while publishing a Super Friday newsletter. Teens will also have fun playing games that build friendships and social skills!

Super Friday Classic

Classic! Students choose 3 classes each semester from a crazy variety of extracurricular activities and crafts! Have you always wanted to learn to make jewelry? Play chess? Grow your own food? We've got you covered! Course offerings will be released soon, with old favorites and some new classes that will be a blast!

Classic Program Class Options

3-D Printing – (\$15 class fee) (H. Gilbert) **Students 10 and older**

Get ready to turn your wildest ideas into tangible creations! In this class, you'll dive into the world of 3D printing, where you'll design, model, and bring your imagination to life. From keychains to collapsible swords, the only limit is your creativity. You'll also learn about the inner workings of a 3D printer and how to design your own models in programs such as Tinkercad and Blender. Let's turn ideas into reality, one layer at a time!

Students will need a laptop and intermediate experience working with computers.

ADV LEGO Robotics – (class fee \$50) (R. Hatton)

(Student must have taken BEG LEGO Robotics. If you need clarification on whether your child qualifies, contact Dawn Pruyn.)

Go beyond just building with Legos and get started programming! Sounds, lights, and turns...can you and your creation meet the goal? Join us and find out.

In Advanced Robotics, students will build and program structures using the LegoWedo2.0 app. Students will use their prior skills and imaginations to complete the LegoWedo2.0 open-ended projects and challenges.

Beginning LEGO Robotics – (\$50 class fee) (R. Hatton)

Go beyond just building with Legos and get started programming! Sounds, lights, and turns...can you and your creation meet the goal? Join us and find out. In Beginning Robotics, students will build and program structures using the Lego Wedo2.0 app. The provided step-by-step projects are perfect for novel learners to acquire the mechanics of block coding.

Chess for Boys – (C. Saucedo)

This class will show students how to move the pieces, how the game is won or lost, and basic tactics. For those who already know the basics, we will learn and build our strategies and skills through lessons and play. *This class is for Boys only.*

Chess for Girls – (B. Alder)

This class will show students how to move the pieces, how the game is won or lost, and basic tactics. For those who already know the basics, we will learn and build our strategies and skills through lessons and play. *This class is for girls only.*

Clay Creations – (\$15 supply fee) (S. and G. Pederson) **Students 10 and older**

This long-awaited class will be an opportunity to make and use an array of different types of clay, such as polymer, air-dried, foam, and even homemade! Students can expect to see projects such as game boards, magnets, picture frames, clay animals, holiday ornaments, and rings, to name a few. Some weeks, we will also be painting our completed creations.

Conversational Spanish – (P. Bourde)

The class will appeal to all learning types. We will have fun playing many engaging games, completing crafts, singing songs, and role-playing. In addition, students will practice vocabulary and pronunciation to enable them to order in a restaurant, ask for help, and carry on a short conversation. Students will need to bring a pocket folder on the first day of class. They will take home the course outline and vocabulary sheets each week.

Creating with Perler Beads – (\$10 supply fee) (C. Battle)

Join us for a semester of fun making melty bead designs. Beads are placed on a peg board and melted with a hot iron. Don't worry, an adult will be doing all the ironing! We will have some set projects, some challenge projects, and some themed projects (without a set pattern!) Great projects for both boys and girls!

Crochet for all Levels – (E. Goodrum & N. Goodrum)

Have you always wanted to crochet? Come learn all the basics at your own pace in a friendly environment or take your skills a step up. We will also work on some fun and easy projects!

Dipping into Color – (\$15 supply fee) (J. Hornick)

Children will learn about the color wheel and primary, secondary, and tertiary colors. They will learn to mix and create colors, shading, shadowing, and tones. Join us as we combine all these things and sprinkle in imagination to create colorful works of art!

Drawing for All Ages—(\$15 supply fee) (J. Hornick)

Children will learn the basics of drawing in pencil and graphite, including different shading techniques, light sources, and how to place shadows for a more realistic effect. They will learn how to simplify objects, making drawing easier and more fun while putting ideas on paper and giving their art more depth.

Duct Tape Warfare – (\$15 supply fee) (C. White)

For students new to Duct Tape Warfare and younger students

Come explore Medieval history and culture with us as we create Knight-style weapons out of duct tape, foam, and PVC pipe. No experience is required!

Friday Players – (\$35 class fee) (M. Magill)**Students should be able to read and memorize lines**

It's show time! Friday Players is a TWO PERIOD musical theatre class. (2ND AND 3RD PERIOD, with snack time in the middle) The children will receive a script along with songs, and we will rehearse our play during class time. There will be a performance at the end of the semester to show off our hard work. We hope to see you onstage! ***Please note that this class requires work and time OUTSIDE of our class time to memorize and learn their routines. ***

Gardening for Good – (A. Moore)

This class will introduce the children to God's plan for gardening in a fun and interactive way. We have been given the power and dominion to GROW THINGS! You can grow your own food indoors and outdoors, no matter the space. Students will take home a growing kit to work on and share their progress as we learn.

Girls Bible Study with Prayer and Journaling – (\$15 class fee) (S. Siu)

Join us in studying, learning, praying, and encouraging one another in our walk.

Gymnastics – (M. Estrada)

Join us for a fun and energetic class as we learn and grow in our flexibility, strength, balance, and coordination through gymnastics. This class is for all levels of gymnasts: those wondering what gymnastics is all about, those who have lots of experience, and everyone in between!

Jewelry Making – (\$15 supply fee) (J. Pederson) **Students 10 and older**

Students will learn to use various jewelry-making tools and supplies to create a wide range of projects, including earrings, bracelets, necklaces, ear cuffs, anklets, rings, and more! Each week, we will create a new piece of jewelry customizable to each student—no two pieces will be alike. Please consider that this class will involve a high level of fine motor skills to complete tasks.

LEGO Innovations – (Gilbert and Bosquez)

Construct and unleash your creativity with Lego! Each week, we will have a brief lesson and a Lego building challenge. During class, students will be able to build Lego models based on topics such as transportation, architecture, geography, history, and more! Each Lego challenge will allow the student to develop their own creation inspired by that week's lesson.

Minute to Win It –(C. Bryant)

You have a minute—can you win it? Get ready to shake, rattle, and roll as you compete with your classmates to win wacky challenges. This is an active class and requires no previous skills—just a good attitude and a readiness to have fun!

Nailed It! – (\$15 supply fee) (S. Curtis)

Join us for this Pinterest-inspired class, where we will conquer fun crafts you can use, wear, or hang on the wall!

Nutrition& Fitness – (J. Estrada & S. Siu) **For students 10 and older**

This class is based on 1 Corinthians 6:19, "Don't you realize that your body is the temple of the Holy Spirit, who lives in you and was given to you by God? We will look at how to be good stewards of our bodies by fueling and strengthening them. We will learn exercises with bands and body weight to be the best we can be for His glory!

Physical Education – (J. Estrada)

Want to get your blood pumping? Feel the need to jump and shout? This class is all about fun! We will play lots of games and have a great time while we get moving! Come have some fun with us!

Pickleball – (A. Bryant)

Be a part of the sports sensation that is sweeping the nation! Learn the rules, skill sets, and practice with your friends.

Pokémon the Card Game – (\$15 supply fee) (M. Lowery & D. Ramirez)

Learn the basics of this popular game while also learning good sportsmanship, players etiquette, arithmetic, logical/strategic thinking, reading comprehension, and socialization. *Students will receive their own deck and other game supplies, which are included with the supply fee.*

Rubik's Cube – (\$5 supply fee) (B. Alder)

Have you ever wanted to impress your friends by solving a Rubik's cube? This class will explore different tips and tricks for solving a basic 3x3 Rubik's cube and introduce other shapes and sizes of cubes often found in competitions.

The supply fee includes a speed-turning cube.

Sewing, Embroidery and Stuffing Making – (D. Valdez)

Join us as we learn hand stitching, hand embroidery, and machine sewing in this brand-new class. Students will also get to design and make their own stuffed animals.

Students are not required to bring a sewing machine. We will provide equipment and supplies; students may bring their own fabric choices.

Skit-tacular – (\$15 class fee) (M. Magill)

A fun theatre class that focuses on building performance skills through skits! Every two weeks, students will form groups and work together to create their own skits, then perform their creations for their classmates. At the end of the semester, we will showcase our work to family and friends! Skills and topics include pantomime, acting with props, duets, lip sync, and storytelling. See you onstage!

Speed Stacks – (C. Miller)

Speed Stacking is one of the fastest-growing sports and was inducted into the Jr. Olympics in 2010. Speed stacking helps child stackers use both sides of their bodies and brains to develop important athletic and academic lifelong skills. Students will take their stacking to the next level, learning more competitions, doubles, games, and more advanced stacking!

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Sportball – (\$65 class fee) T. Yates

Sportball teaches the fundamental skills of 8 different sports in a fun, stress-free, non-competitive setting. Classes keep kids moving and engaged and send them home with new skills. The Sportball coach provides all the equipment. Sports instructions will cover basketball, soccer, t-ball, hockey, volleyball, tennis, golf, and football. Students are welcome to take Sportball more than once! There is so much to learn, and skills will be improved each week.

Strategy Board Games – (W. Berry)

Strategy Board Games is a class for students to learn and play board games. Students will work on teamwork, sportsmanship, and strategy. Board games are an excellent learning tool in which students don't even realize they are learning because they are having so much fun! Potential games include Settlers of Catan, Pandemic, Trekking the National Parks, 7 Wonders, and Stone Age.

Strategy Board Games ADV – (W. Berry)

In this class, your student will work to develop their very own board game! Working with a partner or sometimes in a group, students will brainstorm, design, develop, and test their game, ending the semester with a working game!

Tournament Chess – (B. Alder)

Engage in different types of tournament play to take your chess game to the next level. Learn to track plays, keep score, and use a timer.
